Final conference of the Comenius Lifelong Learning Network SUPPORT

19-23 April, 2010 Bergen, Norway

The SUPPORT network and the City of Bergen welcome education policy makers, school authorities, teacher trainers, researchers, teachers and others working for Education for Sustainable Development (ESD) to the conference in Bergen, April 19-23, 2010.

This conference builds on the activities and themes of the 3-year Comenius Lifelong Learning network project "SUPPORT: Partnership and participation for a sustainable tomorrow." Conference participants will bring to the conference their experiences in implementing Education for Sustainable Development (ESD).

About the conference

Objectives

The ultimate objective of the SUPPORT project is to promote high quality ESD. Current issues and findings in ESD will be presented and discussed, thus building a shared understanding of the challenges of reorienting education policy, school development and teaching practice to develop competencies needed for sustainable development. Findings from the SUPPORT network will be presented with a view to dissemination and exploitation. Through group work and discussions, the conference participants will develop an agenda for action and priorities for the continuation of the UN Decade for ESD at levels ranging from the classroom to educational policy.

Methodology

Keynote inputs will provide current perspectives on the learning outcomes of ESD, methodologies for achieving these outcomes, and the challenge of developing effective educational policy and practice in ESD. Group work and poster sessions will provide opportunities for exchange of experience and discussion of factors facilitating or hindering the development of education systems in Europe to support high quality ESD. In particular, the conference will focus on how pupils can participate in local and global sustainability issues, how schools can collaborate with community and research, and how ICT tools can promote partnership and participation in ESD. The discussion will draw heavily on the results of SUPPORT including concrete experiences in European and other countries, a book on school collaboration in ESD and an innovative school campaign "CO2nnect: CO2 on the way to school," see www.co2nnect.org.

Follow-up

The results of the conference will be published and disseminated. Participants will follow up the training by integrating greater awareness and understanding of the dynamics of educational change for ESD in their own educational institutions and settings.

Wednesday April 21st (Day 2)

Examples of topics: models of school collaboration in ESD • Learning outcomes of ESD and assessment of competencies • Innovative learning environments • Global perspectives in ESD • Teacher competencies and –training • Integration of ESD in education policy (curricula, teacher training, quality assurance) • School resources and support strategies for ESD • Current state of educational research in ESD • School leadership and organisational development for ESD • Lifelong learning and ESD • The role of external partners in ESD.

Presentation and discussion in plenary session.

Thursday April 22nd (Day 3)

Building on the work from Days 1 and 2, participants will form task forces to produce agendas for action and priorities from the perspective of the many diverse actors in ESD: teachers, pupils, school leaders, school administrators, teacher trainers, school partners, researchers, programme developers, educational policymakers.

Friday April 23rd (Day 4)

Conference reporters present the outcomes and recommendations of the conference in plenary session. Comments and discussion by invited experts. Conference closing, lunch and departure.
