Join Margaret Fleming (MF Associates) and Angus Willson (Pannage) for this month's practical webinar on Climate Change, Science and Geography.

Margaret will focus on how Science and Geography ESD learning links School & Community collaboration. This webinar will take a very practical approach where you will audit the current geography and science curricula to

show where Sustainability Education now sits. You will also be shown the [Comenius CoDeS](#) project which adds extra value to this process by showing how these audits make learning more meaningful to the whole school community.

Angus will then explore if climate change provides a meta-narrative for secondary geography, and how we can demonstrate high-level thinking and progression through geographical enquiry.

You will:
